



March 2024

Last month, the final parish families were announced across the archdiocese, and this month all pastors and key parish leadership attended in-person regional trainings focused on the next phases of the Partners in the Gospel journey. They learned about the key activities that should take place in each phase of the process.



Phase 0: Prepare

We are currently in Phase Zero, which is a time of preparation. Please continue to pray for this effort. Specifically, we pray that parishioners open their hearts to the Holy Spirit and that the Holy Spirit helps lead us on this journey. We also ask everyone to pray for the Priest Placement Board and our priests as they work together to find the best fit leaders for our parishes.

Q: What is the role of the parish liaison?

A: Parish liaisons are professionals, hired and trained by the Archdiocese of Seattle, who will work in partnership with multiple parish families' pastors and their leadership teams to implement the parish family structure.

Each liaison will provide guidance, project management support, and ensure effective communication between the Partners in the Gospel core team, parish family pastor and staff, and the Planning and Mission Effectiveness team. The liaison will also support the parish in the creation of the One Parish Plan, which will be presented to the archbishop (in about three years for most parish families) before becoming one canonical parish. Liaisons will start working with parishes starting this March.
