

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to an account by fifteenth-century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

**Sunday Reading Synopsis:** The Lord is king (Ps) and there is no other (1). We are to render to God, therefore, fitting praise and service, as is God's due (3). God's word to us, in turn, is a matter of power and strength, to be lived with conviction of heart (2).



*From November 1st– 26th please bring to church framed pictures of your deceased family and friends for a special display at the foot of the Altar.*




*This is a beautiful way to pray for our faithful departed as we remember them at the holy sacrifice of the Mass.*

**History of Popes** We know the current pope traces his authority all the way back to the first pope (St. Peter). But do you know much about all the popes in between? Join us on a journey from St. Peter all the way to Pope Francis.

### #33 St. Sylvester I, Pope from 314-335 AD



Though St. Sylvester wasn't actually present, the crowning achievement of the Church while he was pope was undoubtedly the Church's first general council, 325's First Council of Nicea (modern-day Turkey).

Convened by Constantine and attended by two of Sylvester's delegates, the main reason for the council was to deal with the Arian heresy, a belief that Christ was a mere man, the first creature, and the origin of all creatures who came after him. In addition to condemning Arianism, it was this council that produced the Nicene Creed, which we still recite after the homily on Sundays and special feast days. Though it was his delegates who signed off on the council's conclusions, St. Sylvester's acceptance of their decision indicates, by extension, his stamp of approval as well.


